Progress report of the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan programme

Unnat Bharat Abhiyan(UBA), MHRD sanctioned Unnat Bharat Abhiyan project to University. The university signed MoU with UBA IIT Delhi Rs. 1.75 Lakh was transferred in university account on 11.04.2018 as financial assistance from UBA. A request was made by university administration with the district collector, Satna to approve 5 villages nearby university to organise developmental activities under UBA. Considering the request, Chief Executive Officer, Zila Panchayat, Satna wide letter No. 297/2017-18 dated 13.04.2018 approved 5 villages namely Tedhee, Patmania, Amaha, Hardua and Paldev and agreed to provide all necessary facilities

The university organised a workshop on 18.05.2018 to discuss on various issues related to UBA and to solicit support from all the stakeholders. People's elected representatives, faculty members of the university and representatives of voluntary organisations participated in the workshop and expressed their views on successful implementation of UBA programme in adopted villages. The workshop was chaired by Shri Abhay Mahajan, Secretary of Deen Dayal Research Institute (an NGO). During the workshop it was resolved that students would undertake survey work and feed the data in UBA ERP software. It was resolved that assistance of district administration including block health and agriculture department would be taken to promote convergence.



Survey and data feeding

Students of MBA(Rural Management) and MSW completed survey of 593 families as per the proforma of UBA. Students of MBA(Rural Management) completed village survey of all 5 adopted villages and fed it on the UBA ERP software. Complete village profile is available on the UBA portal.

Krishak Goshthi

Most of the villagers of the adopted villages are dependent on the agriculture. The university UBA team organised a Krishak goshthi (Workshop of farmers) in the Amaha village in which faculty members of university's agriculture faculty and 52 farmers participated and exchanged their views on making agriculture a sustainable source of livelihood. Free saplings of lemon were distributed to farmers to promote use of lemon among children and women.



Exposure visit in university farm

UBA team of the agriculture faculty organised an exposure visit of farmers of Tedhee and Amaha village in the university's agriculture farm. An orientation programme was organised in the farmers training centre of the university on modern farming technologies and methods to undertake sustainable farming in the adopted villages.

Mass awareness programme

Students of MBA(Rural Management) course organised mass awareness drive in the adopted villages including wall writing and awareness rally on 08 July 2019 in Tedhee Gram panchayat. The vice chancellor of the university paved the way for awareness rally with green signal. Total 169 children, students, youths and girls and students and UBA coordinator of the university participated in the rally from Junior high school Tedhee to Gupta Godavari.



Health camp

With the start of rainy season, villagers become ill due to various infections. Considering it, UBA team of the university discussed with the block medical officer to help in the organisation of health camp in the Tedhee village. The block medical team joined UBA team and a health camp was organised on 09 July 2019 at primary school Tedhee. Total 102 patients were advised on different ailments and were given free medicines procured from CHC Majhgawan.



Farmers training

A farmers training programme was organised on 17 July 2019 in Tedhee village in which 37 farmers including 5 women farmers participated and learnt on scientific cultivation and method to double their income through adoption of high yielding variety of seeds and sustainable farming technologies. The vice chancellor of the university asked farmers to use onion and other crops which can be easily grown in the field and have no marketing problem. Faculty members of agriculture faculty delivered lectures on different themes and answered the queries asked by farmers.

Distribution of high yielding variety of seeds

The UBA team of the university under the leadership of vice chancellor Prof. N C Gautam distributed 250 kg of high yielding variety of seeds to 38 farmers of Tedhee gram panchayat with the help of agriculture department of Majhgawan janpad panchayat on 17 July 2019.



Promotion of microfinance and micro-enterprise development

The university's UBA team has been actively engaged promotion of micro-finance initiatives in the adopted villages. 3 self-help groups have been formed in village Tedhee. Their linkage process with National Rural Livelihood Mission (NRLM) is under progress. All groups have opened their account in the bank branch and are regularly saving from their monthly contribution. With the evidence of saving, groups will be able to get revolving fund of Rs. 12 000 from NRLM fund. The groups are poised to get revolving fund so that their grading is done and based on grading they could get livelihood fund from NRLM. Since villages have agriculture linked occupations, group members are largely involved in micro-enterprises of agriculture, goat rearing and dairying.
