

1. Introduction



Chitrakoot has been a symbol of sublime culture and social order since ancient times. This idyllic pilgrim resort is known for various places associated with Lord Ram, besides one of the most ancient centers of education and research. Maharishi Atri and Anasuya founded the first educational centre of the world at Chitrakoot. This holy place of Chitrakoot has been a place of 'Sadhana' for great saints and Rishi's like Maharashi Sutikshna, Bharadwaj, Sarbhanga and Balmiki. Students from all parts of the country would come to the various ashramas of Rishis and Munis. Lord Ram imparted the message of creating sustainable social structure at Chitrakoot through participatory approach of the natives and other beings. Mahakavi Tulsidas received inspiration to write the epic Sri Ramacharita Manas, which optimizes ideal life in society.

With passage of time and depletion of resources, development of the Chitrakoot was affected. The villages are constrained due to lack of proper growth of Agriculture and agroenterprises. To create enlightened future citizenry and also to realize the Gandhi ji dream of rural development, Mahatma Gandhi Chitrakoot Gramodaya Vishwavidyalaya was established on 12th Feb. 1991 on the banks of the holy river Mandakini through a separate MP Govt. Act (9, 1991) on the auspicious day of Mahashivaratri at Chitrakoot, Distt. Satna (M.P.). The main objectives of the University are to provide education and dissemination of appropriate technology.

Gramodaya University's activities are based on rural development. For more than a decade, its constructive indelible impression is felt in all the dimensions of rural development through its education, research and extension activities. The University creates human resource, develops appropriate technology, conducts research and extension and sustainable techniques for rural livelihood and proper management of rural resources, and it also imparts mass education for the empowerment and awareness of the rural population including women. The University has taken keen interest in exploring alternative sources of energy, developing skills in rural artisans.

The Mahatma Gandhi Chitrakoot Gramodaya Vishwavidyalaya has jurisdiction in the entire state of Madhya Pradesh. The University is making efforts to establish its centre at various places.

The University has a great role to play in the field of rural development through higher education and also in preparing innovative models of rural development. The University is presenting a new vision with a judicious blend of Indian culture and modernity for sustainable rural development.

2. Aims and Objectives

The University receives inspiration for rural development in consonance with the vision of Mahatma Gandhi. The University is mandated to evolve, promote and impart higher education so as to take up emerging challenges for transformation of rural areas. It undertakes academic, research, extension and training programmes for the empowerment of the people with a view to ensuring free flow of knowledge, techniques and technologies as a two-way process for betterment of rural life. It provides training facilities to personnel engaged in rural development in collaboration with the state government. The University provides consultancy in all aspects of rural development. The University undertakes monitoring and evaluation of national and state-level development programmes, shares ideas and experiences in rural development work.

3. Activities

The University has three major activities: education, research and extension. With a view to creating desirable human resource for rural development, the University offers many UG and PG programmes, diploma and certificate courses through regular and distance mode in the field of Management, Sciences, Technology, Agriculture, Animal Husbandry, Health &

Environment, Public Administration, Arts & Designing, Yoga, Ayurveda, Social Sciences, Languages and Culture.

The University's thrust is on action-oriented research. The aim is to see that the research findings in the field of science, technology, arts and social sciences are extended to solve the practical day-to-day rural problems. The University promotes research in the area of alternative sources of energy, qualitative improvement in rural products, inventing new tools and equipment for agriculture, health and hygiene, eradication of rural unemployment, women empowerment, conducting experiments in traditional knowledge and sciences, modern techniques of agriculture, development communication and preservation and propagation of the regional folk art forms.

Extension programme promotes and assists self-help groups in eradicating the menace of rural unemployment, collecting and maintaining data and information of the rural areas, preparation, implementation and evaluation of government and non-government schemes, organizing seminars, conferences, workshops and meeting of locals.

The University conducts its activities in the whole country in collaboration with many leading government and non-government organizations. The University has left its indelible mark in the field of rural development through its education, research, extension and other rural-oriented programmes.

4. Salient Features

The various educational programmes being offered at the Gramodaya University have many unique features. The students get an opportunity to learn under the supervision of competent teachers in the serene environs of the campus. All the educational programmes comprise components like personality development, communication skills and entrepreneurial quality. It is for this reason, that many leading institutions visit us for campus interview.

The University runs its educational programmes in the camp-campus mode keeping in view the need of rural development. This gives the students an opportunity to conduct practical study in villages as a means of healthy escape from the monotonous routine classes. In the competitive world of today, which much depends on one's communication skill, computer training is imparted along with the teaching of English, Hindi and Sanskrit. Remedial classes for the students of Science, Engineering and Technology are also organized.

The University imparts quality knowledge (both theoretical & practical) that most of the students after completing their study are equipped either to take up job with government or non-government organizations or set up their own business.

The University has always seen values and social responsibilities (VSR) as an integral part of Higher Education, and hence, it is a compulsory component in all the educational programmes. The objective is to inculcate a sense of values and social responsibilities among the students. The students not only gain thorough knowledge in their respective fields in the peaceful environments of the campus but also learn the essential components like self-reliance, personality development and entrepreneurship skill, a unique feature of the University.

The University's educational programmes are fully recognized by the statutory bodies like AICTE, NCTE, ICAR and UGC. The University students also get ample opportunities to participate in co-curricular activities like debates, declamations, elocutions, quiz, cultural activities, sports and NSS.

5. Resources and Facilities

Agriculture Research Farm: The University has a 189-acre agriculture farm with irrigation facility where the students conduct research to develop innovative techniques of agriculture and to display improved agricultural techniques.

GIS Lab: University has an up-to date and highly sophisticated Remote Sensing and Geo-Informatics lab.

Computer Centre: Computer training is an integral part of the all University programmes. The University has computer centre as a central facility. It has 300 computers with need-based updated software. Internet facility for all the students is also available.

Audio-visual centre: For optimum use of the media, the University has an audio-visual centre, where students are trained in photography and film making. A Video-Conferencing facility and online learning is also a distinctive feature.

Laboratories: There are labs for science, environment and technology educational programmes.

Central Library (Jigyasa): The University has a sophisticated (e-library) central library called "Jigyasa". It is fully computerized and gets UGC help through INFLIBNET

Programme. The library keeps a regular supply of research journals, abstracts, magazines and journals of various subjects, employment related magazines along with other national and regional newspapers.

Yoga Centre: Yoga training is compulsory for all the University students and the task of imparting theoretical and practical knowledge is being done by our competent Yoga teachers. The UGC has identified /recognized Yoga centre as a quality centre for human consciousness and Yoga Science education.

Physical Education, Sports Centre: Indoor and outdoor sports facilities exist for physical and mental alertness of the students. The students participate in the various sports competitions conducted by the university.

Health Centre and Rasshala: There is an Ayurveda centre for regular health checkup and treatment of students. It has "Rasashala" to prepare medicines by Ayurvedic methods.

Music Training Centre: The University has a music centre to give aesthetic shape to the student's musical aptitude. Folk music and puppetry are also associated with it. It also imparts special training in Sugam Sangeet.

Other Academic Programmes: Many other diploma and certificate programmes of interest are offered to promote the skills of the students.

Assembly Hall: The University has a well-furnished assembly hall to accommodate about 250 people, where seminars, conferences and other events are organized. Besides this the University has an open theatre full of greenery with space to accommodate 5000 peoples.

6. Other facilities

Hostel and Living Places: Separate hostel facilities are available in the campus for male and female students. Another boys and girls hostels are being added that will provide accommodation to 100 boys and 50 girls. Off-campus rental rooms are also available where students can live single or sharing basis.

Transport facility: The University has conveyance facility at a reasonable fare for the students.

Canteen: Canteen in the campus caters food and refreshments to the students.

Scholarship/Fellowship: SC/ST/OBC students are given scholarship/fellowship as per MP Govt. regulations. "Gaon ki Beti" Yojana launched by M.P. Govt. is also available. Besides SC/ST students can avail UGC sponsored fellowship to pursue Ph.D. Studies.

Rail concession: Student's rail concessions are provided as per the directives of the Railway Ministry, Govt. of India.

Campus Interview: Many leading institutes and companies visit the University for campus Interview and select talent from the management, science, technology and other vocational programmes.

7. General Guide Lines to Candidates Seeking Admission in the University

1. Admission

- 1.1 Admission to every diploma/degree programme shall be made at the commencement of the first semester/year of each academic session except for Research degrees. Registration for Ph.D. degree shall be made.
- 1.2 The application for admission to a diploma/degree programme shall be made in the prescribed form along with the application fee prescribed from time to time and it should be registered and submitted online on website www.mgcgv.mponline.gov.in on or before the last date fixed for the purpose. Each selected candidate shall require to its document verification at university admission cell and thereafter submit its fees.

2. Application form for admission

- 2.1 The prospectus for the advertised courses is available online on website of the Mahatma Gandhi Chitrakoot Gramodaya Vishwavidyalaya for session 2025-26 (except those conducted through MPESB, Bhopal).
- 2.2 Online application can be filled through MPONLINE Portal www.mgcgv.mponline.gov.in link with prescribed application fees.

3. Document verification to be appended with the application form

- 3.1 Photostat copies of 10th standard Certificates bearing date of birth, 12th/Graduation/ Post Graduation exam mark sheets/Certificates and 2 passport size photographs.
- 3.2 Domicile certificate of MP, caste Certificate, Income certificate (Issued only by a SDM or Higher authorities).
- 3.3 Character certificate
- 3.4 Affidavit for the gap year in education.

Note: Original certificates must not be given with the application form.

4. Reservations, Concessions, Relaxations

- 4.1 Subject to the reservations, concessions, relaxations and weightage to be given to different categories of candidates for admission/re-admission in the University (which shall invariable he/she indicated in the M. P. Government Higher Education Department Ministry of Bhopal. Admission rules and regulation 2025-26 are strictly in order of merit reckoned on the basis of an Admission test/ Interview or in the manner decided by the University or MPESB and specifically mentioned in the advertisement.
- 4.2 All applications received in the University shall first be screened on the basis of merit, test and /or interview (as the case may be) conducted. An Admissions Committee, keeping in view the reservations/concessions for different categories in accordance with the rules in force at the time, shall make the final selections.
- 4.3 Application forms may be rejected on the following grounds.
 - (i) Online application form without fees submission,
 - (ii) Application forms without duly signed photos,
 - (iii) Application form without the applicant's signature,
 - (iv) Application form of the candidates having non-recognized degrees.

5. Entrance admit card

Admit card shall be downloaded by candidate from the university website as on proposed date.

6. Entrance examination and entry into the exam hall

- 6.1 Entrance Examination will be held on date mentioned in the advertisement.
- 6.2 Examination will start at 11.30 am. The applicant shall come 30 minutes prior to the examination time. Candidates coming late by more than 30 minutes after the exam has started shall be denied to appear in the examination.
- 6.3 Entrance examination test should be of 2 hours duration.
- 6.4 The candidates must submit the OMR and Question Booklet to the invigilator.
- 6.5 Use of unfair means is strictly prohibited. Candidates caught using unfair means shall be declared ineligible for admission.

7. Entrance Examination

Candidate shall be tested for their subject knowledge, general knowledge, communication skill and general aptitude. Question paper shall consist of multiple-choice type questions. Graduate level questions for M. Sc. Ag. Degree Programmes and PG level for the Ph. D. programme as per concerning subject.

8. Admission Result

The result of qualified candidates shall be displayed on the University notice board/University website: www.gramodayachitrakoot.ac.in.

9. Eligibility

- 9.1 Applicants who have appeared any final examination are also eligible for provisional admission. However they have to submit the relevant left over documents within 30 days of the declaration of entrance result.
- 9.2 University has the right to cancel the admission of any candidate.
- 9.3 The University can deny admission to any student who had been convicted by a court of law for any recognizable offence or whose character has not been certified, or who had been punished for using unfair means in the examinations, or is/was accused of moral turpitude or is known to be potential trouble maker and bad character.

10. Enrolment / Registration

- 10.1 Online enrolment (once in a total duration) and Registration (in each semester) of student in any programme is compulsory and necessary for the award of diploma/degree as governed by the admission rules. Each student get enrolled at the time of admission in the University will get an Enrolment No. and this enrolment number will remain same till the competition of his education from the University.
- 10.2 Admission of new student if failed to enroll in the prescribed manner upto the proposed date is liable to be cancelled and the vacant seat shall be offered to another candidates in the waiting list.
- 10.3 In order to enroll himself as a student of the University, a candidate finally selected for admission to a particular course, at the time of admission has to:
 - (a) Pay all fees online as prescribed by the University.
 - (b) Submit transfer certificate and character certificate from the institution last attended.
 - (c) If enrolled earlier as a student of another University, submit migration certificate/eligibility certificate, as the case may be, from the University last attended along with all such documents as may be required for the purpose.
- 10.4 A candidate, who for any reason, cannot submit all or any documents required immediately may be admitted and registered provisionally on payment of necessary fees subject to giving an undertaking to submit necessary documents within two weeks failing which the admission shall be cancelled and all moneys paid by him/her shall be forfeited.
- 10.5 The documents and certificates required by the University and submitted by the student during admission and registration shall not be returned, even temporarily, to the student under any circumstance.
- 10.6 In case a candidate who has offered a seat in the University does not join by the last prescribed date his/her admission shall be cancelled and the vacant seat shall be offered to the person next in the Admission Waiting List.
- 10.7 Students freshly admitted, as well as continuing students, shall present themselves in the beginning of each Semester on/at the place and the dates notified by the

Academic Committee for Counseling where they shall be assigned to Advisors/Course Instructors by the Dean/Director, concerned.

10.9 Every student shall have an Advisor to help the students in planning the programme of their studies who shall maintain a close contact with the students allotted to him/her and keep himself/herself informed of their progress.

11. Change of Field of Study

Based on the merit a student may be permitted to change his field of study after second semester if he has passed all the subjects and seats are available in the desired field of study by the Vice Chancellor on the recommendation of both Head of Departments and Dean of the Faculties: provided he meets the qualification and admission requirement fixed by the University/MPESB Bhopal. This opportunity however, shall be limited to a maximum of 10% of the total admitted students in the course.

Note: Other rules for the admission, registration, examination, award of degree conduct are provided in university ordinances and regulations.

8. Hostel Rule

- 1. Application for admission in the hostel shall be made from hostel office/office of the DSW on payment of fees as/in the prescribed form. The application form filled should reach hostel/DSW office before the prescribed date.
- 2. Each applicant for admission shall submit the character certificate from the Head of the institution, last attended along with an application.
- 3. Old hostellers seeking readmission may also apply for admission ensuring clearance of 'No Dues' of previous year (if any), then deposit their readmission dues.
- 4. No student, who has failed/dropped out in the examination or warned for any disciplinary action shall be readmitted to the hostel.
- 5. After an applicant has been admitted or readmitted he/she will be allotted a bed in the hostel room by the warden.
- 6. Hostellers shall be responsible for the security of their own property. They must not leave their room/box unlocked in their absence. Luxury items are strongly prohibited and the management is not responsible for security/safety problems arising due to this.
- 7. Student newly admitted to the hostel shall be required to present before the Medical Officer appointed/nominated by the University for Medical Examination.

- 8. Every hosteller shall maintain a high standard of discipline, have respect for the tradition of the University and conduct a dignified manner within and outside the hostel. No unnecessary actions are allowed, which may cause noise, disturbance or distraction in studies or may be deemed irregular in any way.
- 9. Hostellers have to pay the monthly rent for 11 months in a year.
- 10. Every students admitted or readmitted to the hostel will have to pay caution money refundable at the time of leaving the hostel or completion of the degree.
- 11. The facility of mess/canteen shall be provided by the University on payment basis, cooking is strictly prohibited in the hostel.
- 12. It would be compulsory for the hostellers to have their meals in the mess/canteen. Night meals for girls shall be arranged to be sent to their hostel if not available in the mess.

Note: Detailed rule for the Hostellers included in the University ordinance and regulation.

9. Admission Process


